The month of February begins the long stretch to the end of the school year. I am hopeful our students' academic focus will propel them to achieve at the highest levels this semester. Since decisions made this month could have a significant impact on your student's college experience, we have chosen "college" as our focus for this newsletter.

In February, underclass parents will complete the high school scheduling process while senior parents complete those all-important financial aid forms and college scholarship applications. During the last two months, we have received numerous visits from our recent graduates who were home from college. It is always a joy to reconnect with our students. Typically, we talk about the fit of the college, and I always ask the same question, "So did we prepare you?" We repeatedly hear the same story from our graduates; they feel more prepared than their college classmates because they took rigorous college-level courses at FHS. This feedback reinforces our focus beyond just high school graduation and college admissions. Our focus is not to simply get our students *into* college; it is to make sure our students are *successful while in college*. I encourage FHS parents to consider this focus when making your course selections for next year.

While our graduates have been successful navigating the challenges of college, our current students have responded to the challenges of their classes at FHS. Again, I want to thank each and every family for your role in our achievement and our record setting level of academic success last semester. Fall semester's amazing results were as follows:

- Students recorded our highest percentage of A's and B's in school history
- Students achieved our lowest failure rate in school history
- Our junior PSAT scores were the highest in school history

This level of achievement is a continuation of the gains made by last year's graduating class. You will find a summary of three-year state achievement data on page three of this newsletter. Analysis of this data reveals gains in nearly every category. I am especially proud of increases in our graduation rate and our increase in Academic Honors and Core 40 diplomas. Despite more demanding requirements, more of our students are earning the diplomas that verify their college readiness. While academics may not have its own section of the newspaper, achievements like these are front page news! The combination of a caring and dedicated staff with a supportive and involved parent base makes our students' success possible.

Great things are happening at FHS. I am eager and excited to see how we can continue our upward trends this semester. By working together, we can improve the academic achievement of EVERY student!

Thank you for supporting your student and our school. Let's have an outstanding second semester!

PSAT/SAT

Sophomores and Juniors have received their PSAT scores. We encourage all 10th and 11th graders to use their score report along with the tools available through the College Board to help prepare for SAT tests as well as for career and college searching. From the PSAT scores, we are able to generate an AP Potential tool that indicates if a student is demonstrating the potential to be successful in Advanced Placement courses. Letters were mailed home indicating this information. We encourage students/parents to utilize this tool as they make course selections for the 2012-2013 school year.

CLASS SCHEDULING FOR 2012 - 2013

Counselors have been meeting with students regarding their course selections for the 2012-2013 school year. We encourage you to talk with your son/daughter about their course selection and how these decisions impact their long term academic goals for the future. Students should have brought home their Course Description Guide. The Course Description Guide can also be viewed on the Fishers HS website. We will finalize the course selection process at the end of February. Please feel free to call the appropriate counselor if you have any questions. **Any changes requested by students or parents need to be made by May 31, 2012.**



Students should attend with their parent(s) or guardian(s) and bring their parents' completed 2010 IRS 1040 tax returns, W-2 Forms and other 2010 income and benefits information. If students worked last year, they should also bring their income information. Students, 24 years or older, may attend alone and bring their own completed 2010 IRS 1040 tax return, W-2 Form or other 2010 income and benefits information. Pens and FAFSA on the Web Worksheets will be provided, but students are encouraged to bring their own FAFSA on the Web Worksheets and their U.S. Department of Education Personal Identification Numbers (PIN) if filing online. Parents will also need to obtain a PIN to file online. Obtain your PIN prior to College Goal Sunday by going to www.pin.ed.gov



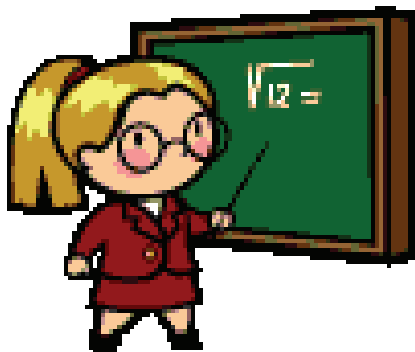

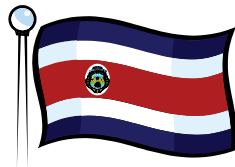
