



Hamilton Southeastern High School Freshman Center FAQ's

We understand that there are many questions surrounding the opening of the Freshman Center for students attending HSE High School in the fall of 2012. Below is a list of questions and answers that have been generated to help provide information about this upcoming change. As more questions arise and answers are provided they will be added to this list. Please check the High School website at <http://www.hse.k12.in.us/hhs> periodically for updates to this document.

What is the Hamilton Southeastern Freshman Center?

The Hamilton Southeastern Freshman Center is the building where all 9th grade students attending Hamilton Southeastern High School will be located beginning in the fall of 2012.

Where will the Freshman Center be located?

The HSE Freshman Center will be located at the current site of Hamilton Southeastern Junior High School, 12001 Olio Road.

If I attend the Freshman Center, am I considered a student at HSE High School?

Yes. The Freshman Center is a satellite campus to the Main building which has been the site of HSE High School.

How will the Freshman Center be staffed?

Some of the teachers that currently teach at HSE High School will move to the Freshman Center during the summer of 2012 to make up the teaching staff in that building. Mr. Matt Kegley will remain the principal for grades 9-12 however, Mrs. Kim Lippe will be the Associate Principal and lead administrator of the Freshman Center. She will be supported by an Assistant Principal and two guidance counselors, including Mrs. Mary Rager, current freshmen guidance counselor. There will also be a school nurse, a school resource officer, and the appropriate secretarial, custodial, and food service staff to meet the needs of the building.

What courses will be taught at the Freshman Center?

Courses that are most often taken by freshmen will be offered at the Freshmen Center. Some courses that freshmen may take may not be offered at the Freshman Center. In this case freshmen will either have to wait until their sophomore year to take the course or in some cases shuttles may transport students to the Main building for class.

When will a current 8th grade student schedule for classes?

As in previous years, eighth grade students will begin the process of scheduling for their freshman year during the first week of February.

How will transportation work for freshmen?

Freshmen students who ride the bus will be dropped off in the morning after the 10th-12th grade students are dropped off. In the afternoon this will happen in reverse with the 9th grade students getting on the bus first and commuting to the Main Campus to pick up the 10th-12th grade students.

Will freshmen students be able to join school clubs and organizations?

Yes. Ultimately club sponsors will determine the location of club meetings. Club meetings may take place either at the Freshman Center or before or after school at the main building so that freshmen students may attend.

Will freshmen be able to attend all school activities like “pep” sessions?

Yes. When opportunities arise in which the entire student body is in attendance, arrangements will be made to bring the freshmen to the Main building.

Where will freshmen participating in athletics go for practice and games?

In all likelihood all games will take place on the fields and courts located at the Main building as they have previously. Practices are yet to be determined but some may take place at the Freshman Center.
